ORDER

WHEREAS on 19 August 2009, Staff of the New Brunswick Securities Commission filed a Motion concerning the Respondents;

AND WHEREAS on 20 August 2009 the New Brunswick Securities Commission issued a Notice of Hearing of Motion setting the hearing date for 9 September 2009, which was subsequently adjourned to a later date;

AND WHEREAS Robert Saintonge resigned his registration as a mutual fund salesperson in New Brunswick effective 1 September 2009;

AND WHEREAS Staff of the New Brunswick Securities Commission have no information to suggest that Robert Saintonge was involved in any fraudulent conduct, or that he was directly involved in the operation or administration of Centre de traitement d'information de crédit (C.T.I.C.) Inc. or CITCAP Groupe Financier Inc.;

AND WHEREAS Staff of the New Brunswick Securities Commission continue to investigate the Respondents;

AND WHEREAS the New Brunswick Securities Commission is of the opinion that it is in the public interest to make this Order;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Pursuant to section 184(1)(d) of the *Securities Act*, S.N.B. 2004, c. S-5.5, any exemptions under New Brunswick securities law do not apply to Robert Saintonge until otherwise ordered by the New Brunswick Securities Commission.
