I give loans or gifts more than I can afford.

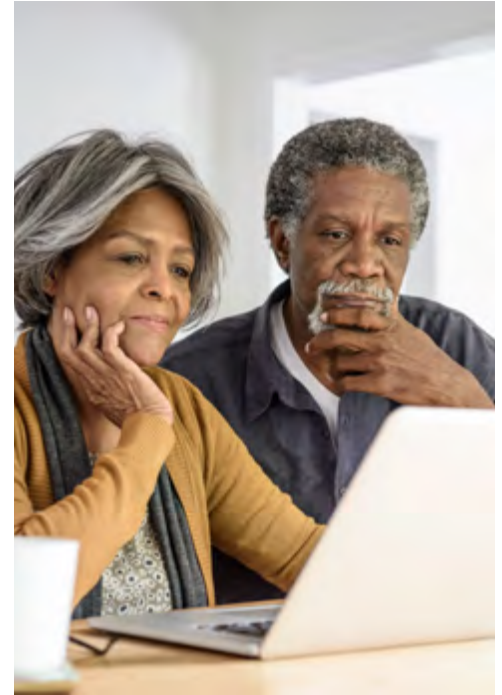
My children, or others around me, are pressuring me to give them money.
